#### BACKGROUND CONTINUED...

• Fall of 2005 – EPA granted \$60,000 in funding to DEQ to assist schools with cleanout costs. 13 school districts requested and received partial reimbursement.

 Townsend at \$4,078


All except Broadus were less then \$9,000

#### **Havre Public Schools**

 Total Cost \$8,785.....plus they had additional issue....

#### **Havre Continued...**

- Worked with College to dispose of the radioactive call DEQ if you need help with this.
- DEQ accepted the elemental mercury.
- Havre developed and implemented a chemical hygiene plan.
- The high school contracted for a remodel on the chemical storage room – new ventilation, fire control, hoods, etc.

# **Another Success Story - Glasgow**

 First School to request funding – cleanout cost of \$6,240

- Glasgow had an interesting unknown.....



## **Glasgow Continued....**

- Developed and fully implemented Chemical Hygiene Program
- Developed and implemented full Environmental,
  Safety and Health Program for the School including Hazcom, Blood Born Pathogens, Incident/Injury Reporting and other required programs.

#### **DEQ Advice**



- Inventory Your Chemicals and start planning for disposal of what is no longer needed or necessary.
   Call DEQ for assistance – we will take elemental mercury and can help coordinate with college chemistry programs to take radioactives.
- Ensure that inventory is properly segregated and stored – use the Flinn or another catalog for assistance.
